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BYLAWS OF THE HEISING-SIMONS FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I PRINCIPAL OFFICE

The principal office of this corporation shall be located anywhere in the State of California as approved by the Board of Directors of this corporation.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP

- Section 1. <u>Voting Members</u>. This corporation shall have one class of members. Each member shall have the same voting rights as specified in these Bylaws. The qualifications or eligibility requirements for membership and the rights and obligations of members shall be as provided in these Bylaws or under applicable law. If at any time, for any reason, there shall be no members of this corporation, and no Guardian Members as defined in Section 3 below, all powers of the membership under these Bylaws or applicable law shall be held by the Board of Directors of this corporation.
- Section 2. <u>Identification of Initial Members</u>. The initial members of this corporation are Mark Heising and Elizabeth Simons, husband and wife, and their two children Caitlin Heising and Matthew Heising.
- Section 3. <u>Admission of Members</u>. The members may admit any person to membership in this corporation by unanimous vote of the then current members. The members may also admit any person to membership contingent upon the occurrence of a future specified event ("Guardian Members").
- Section 4. <u>Membership Roster</u>. This corporation shall keep a membership roster containing the name of each member and the last address provided to this corporation by the member for purposes of notice. This corporation shall also keep a record of any appointed Guardian Members and the last known address of such Guardian Member.
- Section 5. <u>Nonliability of Members</u>. No member of this corporation shall be personally liable for the debts, liabilities, or obligations of this corporation.
- Section 6. <u>Transferability of Memberships</u>. Membership in this corporation, or any right arising therefrom, may not be transferred or assigned. Any attempted transfer shall be void.
- Section 7. <u>Termination of Members</u>. A member's membership in this corporation shall continue until terminated as provided in this Section, or until the member dies, becomes incapacitated as defined in Section 8 below, or resigns in a writing delivered to the

Chair, the Secretary, or the President of this corporation. Membership in this corporation shall terminate upon the occurrence of any of the following events or conditions:

- i. <u>Expiration</u>. If a membership is issued for a period of time, such membership shall automatically terminate when such period of time has elapsed. Any such time limit on any membership must be specified at the time of issuance.
- ii. Removal. Upon the vote of at least two thirds of the total number of then current members, the members may remove any member at any time, for any reason or no reason (including that continued participation by the member in this corporation as a member is not in the best interests of this corporation and the furtherance of its purposes). A member who is proposed to be terminated shall receive reasonable notice of the proposed termination and the reasons therefor, if any, and an opportunity to be heard, orally or in writing, by the other members before the termination vote. The decision of the members to remove a member shall be effective immediately and final. The President and Secretary will be notified promptly in the event of any termination of a member of this corporation.

Section 8. <u>Incapacity</u>. An individual's incapacity for purposes of these Bylaws shall be deemed to exist when it has been declared by a court of competent jurisdiction, or when a conservator for such individual has been appointed, or upon execution of a certificate by a physician licensed to practice in the State of California or wherever such individual may then reside, which states the doctor's opinion that such individual is, by reason of advanced age, infirmity, mental or physical illness, or other disability, unable adequately to provide for his or her personal needs or to manage his or her financial affairs. The effective date of such incapacity shall be the date of the decree adjudicating the incapacity, the date of the decree appointing the conservator, or the date of the doctor's certificate, as the case may be.

ARTICLE III MEMBERSHIP RIGHTS

Section 1. <u>Voting Rights</u>. In addition to voting on any other matters that may properly be presented to members for a vote pursuant to this corporation's Articles, these Bylaws, or by action of the Board of Directors or operation of law, the members shall have the right to vote, as set forth elsewhere in these Bylaws, on the actions listed in this Section.

A. Each of the following actions shall require the unanimous vote of all members at the time of the vote:

- (i) the election of directors;
- (ii) changing the number of directors if fixed in these Bylaws; changing the maximum or minimum number of directors if a range is stated in these Bylaws; changing these Bylaws from a fixed number of directors to a range or vice versa; and setting the authorized number of directors within any range specified in these Bylaws;
- (iii) filling any vacancy on the Board of Directors;

- (iv) all amendments to these Bylaws (whether with or without approval of the Board of Directors); and
- (v) all amendments to the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation (which shall also require the approval of the Board of Directors).
- B. Each of the following actions shall require the vote of two-thirds of all members at the time of the vote:
 - (i) the removal of any director(s) for any reason or no reason, except that the Board of Directors may remove a director for cause as cause is defined in Section 5221 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law;
 - (ii) the disposition of all or substantially all of the assets of this corporation (which shall also require the approval of the Board of Directors);
 - (iii) any merger of this corporation (which shall also require the approval of the Board of Directors);
 - (iv) any voluntary dissolution of this corporation (whether with or without approval of the Board of Directors); and
 - (v) the annual grant-making and operating budgets of this corporation (which shall also require the approval of the Board of Directors).

Section 2. <u>Inspection Rights</u>.

- A. <u>Articles and Bylaws</u>. This corporation shall keep at its principal office in California current copies of the Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws of this corporation, which shall be open to inspection by members at all reasonable times. If this corporation has no principal office in California, the Secretary shall furnish such copies to any member on written request therefor.
- B. Accounting Records; Minutes. On written request, any member (in person or through an agent or attorney) may inspect and copy the accounting books and records of this corporation and the minutes of the proceedings of the members, the Board, or any Board Committee, at any reasonable time and for a purpose reasonably related to the member's interests as a member.
- C. <u>Membership Records</u>. The right of members to have access to the membership records of this corporation shall be governed by Sections 6330 through 6332 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law.
- Section 3. Other Rights. In addition to the rights described in these Bylaws, members of this corporation shall have any other rights afforded voting members under the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law.

ARTICLE IV MEMBER MEETINGS AND VOTING

- Section 1. <u>Member Voting</u>. Each member shall have one vote on each matter on which the members are entitled to vote.
- Section 2. <u>Annual and Special Member Meetings</u>. An annual meeting of the membership will be held in conjunction with the annual meeting of the Board of Directors, at a date, place, and time determined by the Board of Directors, for the purpose of electing directors and transacting such business as may come before the meeting. Special meetings of the members may be called for any purpose (i) by the Board of Directors, the Chair of the Board, or the President, or (ii) by five percent of the then current members, who may also call the annual membership meeting in the event the Board fails to do so.
- Section 3. <u>Member Meetings Not Required</u>. Notwithstanding Section 2 of this Article IV, at any time when the only members of this corporation are the only directors of this corporation, all requirements for meetings of the membership may be dispensed with, and any action of the Board of Directors at a Board meeting may be designated by the Board as an action by, as, and on behalf of the members.
- Section 4. <u>Time and Manner of Notice of Meetings</u>. The Secretary shall give written notice of each members' meeting to each member who would be entitled to vote at such meeting on the date notice is given. The notice shall be delivered to the last address provided by the member to this corporation for purposes of notice, either personally or by telegram, facsimile transmission, electronic transmission in compliance with Article XI, Section 6, or first-class, registered, or certified mail not less than ten nor more than ninety days before the date of such meeting, or by other mail not less than twenty nor more than ninety days before the date of such meeting.
- Section 5. <u>Contents of Notice</u>. The notice shall state the place, date and time of the meeting and (a) in the case of special meetings, the general nature of the business to be transacted, and no other business may be transacted; or (b) in the case of the annual meeting, the names of all those who are nominees for director as of the date of the notice, and those matters which the Board, as of the date of the notice, intends to present for action by the members, but any proper matter may be presented at the annual meeting for such action.
- Section 6. <u>Notice of Certain Actions Required</u>. Unless the vote of all then current members shall be unanimous, any of the following votes shall be valid only if the general nature of the action approved was stated in the notice of the meeting at which the vote occurred: (a) to remove a director for any reason or no reason, (b) to fill a vacancy on the Board, (c) to amend this corporation's Bylaws or Articles of Incorporation, or (d) to voluntarily dissolve this corporation.
- Section 7. <u>Member Quorum</u>. A majority of the memberships then in effect shall constitute a quorum. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough members to leave less than a

quorum, so long as any action taken thereafter is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum.

Section 8. Act of the Members. The act of the majority of the total number of members at the time of the vote shall be the act of the members, except as specifically otherwise provided in Article III, Section 1, or elsewhere in these Bylaws.

Section 9. Manner of Voting.

- A. <u>Voting at Meetings</u>. Voting at meetings may be by voice or by secret ballot, provided that any election of directors, and any other vote designated by the chairman of the meeting, in his or her discretion, or requested by ten percent of the voting power present at the meeting, shall be conducted by secret ballot. Subject to any guidelines and procedures that the Board of Directors may adopt, members not physically present in person at a face-to-face membership meeting may, by electronic transmission in compliance with Section 12 of this Article, or by electronic video screen communication, participate in the meeting, be deemed present in person and vote at the meeting.
- B. <u>Proxy Voting</u>. Any member may grant any other member his or her proxy to vote on any matter put to the vote of the members. The proxy shall be in writing, and may grant the proxyholder the right to vote on any matter in the proxyholder's discretion or may direct the proxyholder how the member's vote shall be cast. Any member who grants a proxy shall be deemed present for any vote at any meeting at which the proxy applies.
 - C. <u>Cumulative Voting Prohibited</u>. Cumulative voting shall not be permitted.

Section 10. Waiver of Notice or Consent by Members.

- A. <u>Generally</u>. Any action of the members taken at a meeting where a quorum is present but for which proper notice was not given, will be valid if, either before or after the meeting, each member entitled to vote who was not present at the meeting signs (i) a waiver of notice, (ii) a consent to holding the meeting, or (iii) an approval of the minutes, in any case in writing, which may include electronic mail or facsimile transmitted by a member in compliance with Article XI, Section 5, of these Bylaws. The waiver of notice, consent to holding the meeting, or approval of minutes need not specify the purpose or general nature of business to be transacted at such meeting, unless action is taken or proposed to be taken on matters specified in Section 6 of this Article, in which case the waiver, consent, or approval must state the general nature of the matter. All such waivers, consents, or approvals shall be filed with the minutes of the meeting.
- B. Effect of Attendance at Meeting. Attendance by a member at a meeting shall also constitute a waiver of notice of that meeting, unless the member attends for the sole purpose of objecting at the beginning of the meeting to the transaction of any business due to the inadequacy or illegality of the notice. Attendance at a meeting is not a waiver of any right to object to the consideration of matters not included in the notice of the meeting which are required to be described therein pursuant to Section 6 of this Article, if that objection is expressly made at the meeting.

Section 11. Action by Unanimous Written Consent. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the members at a meeting (other than termination of a member's membership) may be taken without a meeting if all members shall individually or collectively consent to such action in writing. Any action to terminate a member's membership may only be taken at a meeting and not by written consent. If action is taken by written consent, the consent(s) shall be filed with the corporate minutes. Written consent shall include electronic mail or facsimile transmitted by a member in compliance with Article XI, Section 5, of these Bylaws. The action by written consent shall have the same force and effect as the unanimous vote of the members.

Section 12. <u>Meetings by Electronic Transmission</u>. A meeting of the members may be conducted, in whole or in part, by electronic transmission in compliance with Article XI, Section 5 and Section 6, as applicable, or by electronic media screen communication, so long as all of the following apply:

- (a) This corporation has implemented reasonable measures to provide members a reasonable opportunity to participate in the meeting and to vote on matters submitted to the members, including an opportunity to read or hear the proceedings of the meeting substantially concurrently with those proceedings; and
- (b) If any member votes or takes other action at the meeting by means of electronic transmission or electronic video screen communication, this corporation maintains a record of any vote or action taken by a member by means of electronic transmission.

Any request by this corporation for a member's consent to conduct a meeting by electronic transmission shall include a notice that, absent consent of the member, the face-to-face membership meeting shall be held at a physical location at which members may attend and participate in person.

ARTICLE V BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. <u>Corporate Powers; Exercise By Board</u>. This corporation shall have powers to the full extent allowed by law. Except for the powers reserved to the members in these Bylaws or by the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, all powers and activities of this corporation shall be exercised and managed by the Board of Directors of this corporation directly or, if delegated, under the ultimate direction of the Board.

Section 2. <u>Number and Qualification of Directors</u>. The number of directors shall be not less than one (1) nor more than nine (9), with the exact authorized number of directors to be fixed from time to time by the members in accordance with Article III, Section 1.

Section 3. <u>Limitations on Interested Persons</u>. At all times, not more than forty-nine percent of the directors of this corporation may be interested persons. An interested person means either:

- (a) any person currently being compensated by this corporation for services rendered to it within the previous twelve months, whether as a full-time or part-time employee, independent contractor, or otherwise, excluding any reasonable compensation paid to a director in his or her capacity as director; or
- (b) any brother, sister, ancestor, descendant, spouse, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, mother-in-law, or father-in-law of any such person.
- Section 4. <u>Nomination of Directors</u>. The Board may adopt any reasonable procedures for the nomination of directors. In addition, any member may nominate a director at any meeting of the members at which directors are elected.
- Section 5. <u>Election and Term of Office of Directors</u>. The directors shall be elected at each annual meeting of the members, or, if such directors are not elected at the meeting, they may be elected at any special meeting of the members, or by written ballot. Each director shall be elected for a term of one year. Each director shall hold office until the later of (i) the expiration of the director's term and (ii) until a successor has been elected.
- Section 6. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy shall be deemed to exist on the Board in the event that the actual number of directors is less than the authorized number for any reason, including but not limited to the death, incapacity (as defined in Article II, Section 8), resignation, or removal of a director. Vacancies may be filled only by the members in accordance with Article III, Section 1.
- Section 7. <u>Resignation and Removal of Directors</u>. Resignations shall be effective upon receipt in writing by the Chair of the Board, the President, or the Secretary of this corporation, unless a later effective date is specified in the resignation. The members may remove any director for any reason or no reason at any time in accordance with Article III, Section 1.
- Section 8. <u>Annual Board Meetings</u>. A meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held at least once a year. Annual meetings shall be called by the Chair of the Board, the President, or any two directors, and noticed in accordance with Section 10 of this Article.
- Section 9. <u>Special Board Meetings</u>. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Chair of the Board, the President, or any two directors, and noticed in accordance with Section 10 of this Article.
- Section 10. Notice. Notice of the annual meeting and any special meetings of the Board of Directors shall state the date, place, and time of the meeting and shall be given to each director at least four days before any such meeting if given by first-class mail or forty-eight hours before any such meeting if given personally or by telephone, including a voice messaging system, or by other electronic transmission such as e-mail, in compliance with Article XI, Section 5, of these Bylaws.
- Section 11. <u>Waiver of Notice</u>. The transactions of any meeting of the Board of Directors, however called and noticed and wherever held, shall be valid as though taken at a meeting duly held after proper call and notice, if a quorum is present, and if, either before or

after the meeting, each of the directors not present provides in writing a waiver of notice, a consent to holding the meeting, or an approval of the minutes. The waiver of notice or consent need not specify the purpose of the meeting. All waivers, consents and approvals shall be filed with the corporate records or made a part of the minutes of the meeting. Notice of a meeting shall also be deemed given to any director who attends the meeting without protesting the lack of adequate notice before the meeting or at its commencement.

Section 12. Quorum; Acts of the Board. A majority of the total number of directors then in office shall constitute a quorum, provided that in no event shall the required quorum be less than one-fifth of the authorized number of directors or two directors, whichever is larger. Each director shall have one vote on each matter on which the directors are entitled to vote. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in Article V, Section 13 (taking action without a meeting); Article VI, Section 1 (appointing Board Committees); Article VIII, Section 3 (approving self-dealing transactions); and Article IX, Section 2 (approving indemnification), of these Bylaws or in the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law. A meeting at which a quorum is initially present may continue to transact business notwithstanding the withdrawal of directors, if any action taken is approved by at least a majority of the required quorum for such meeting.

Section 13. <u>Action Without a Meeting</u>. Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board may be taken without a meeting if all members of the Board (other than any director interested in a transaction so approved) shall individually or collectively consent to such action in writing. Such written consents shall be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board, and shall have the same force and effect as the unanimous vote of such directors.

Section 14. <u>Telephone and Electronic Meetings</u>. Directors may participate in a meeting through use of conference telephone, electronic video screen communication, or other electronic transmission in compliance with Article XI, Section 5, of these Bylaws so long as all of the following apply:

- (a) each director participating in the meeting can communicate with all of the other directors concurrently; and
- (b) each director is provided with the means of participating in all matters before the Board, including the capacity to propose, or to interpose an objection to, a specific action to be taken by this corporation.

Section 15. Standard of Care.

A. <u>General</u>. A director shall perform the duties of a director, including duties as a member of any Board Committee on which the director may serve, in good faith, in a manner such director believes to be in the best interest of this corporation and with such care, including reasonable inquiry, as an ordinarily prudent person in a like situation would use under similar circumstances. These duties include the duties to pay reasonable attention to this corporation's affairs, to attend Board meetings, to act without conflicts of interest on Board

decisions and only after full disclosure, and to maintain the confidentiality of this corporation's confidential information.

In performing the duties of a director, a director shall be entitled to rely on information, opinions, reports, or statements, including financial statements and other financial data, in each case prepared or presented by:

- (i) one or more officers or employees of this corporation whom the director believes to be reliable and competent as to the matters presented;
- (ii) counsel, independent accountants, or other persons as to matters which the director believes to be within such person's professional or expert competence; or
- (iii) committee upon which the director does not serve that is composed exclusively of any combination of directors or persons described in (i) or (ii) above, as to matters within the committee's designated authority, provided that the director believes such committee merits confidence;

so long as in any such case, the director acts in good faith after reasonable inquiry when the need therefor is indicated by the circumstances and without knowledge that would cause such reliance to be unwarranted.

Except as provided in Article VIII below, a person who performs the duties of a director in accordance with this Section shall have no liability based upon any failure or alleged failure to discharge that person's obligations as a director, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any actions or omissions which exceed or defeat a public or charitable purpose to which this corporation, or assets held by it, are dedicated.

- B. <u>Investments</u>. Except with respect to assets held for use or used directly in carrying out this corporation's public or charitable activities, in managing and investing this corporation's investments, the Board shall adhere to the standards set forth in the preceding Paragraph A, above, and shall: (a) consider the charitable purposes of this corporation; and (b) consider:
 - (1) General economic conditions;
 - (2) The possible effect of inflation or deflation;
 - (3) The expected tax consequences, if any, of investment decisions or strategies;
 - (4) The role that each investment or course of action plays within the overall portfolio;
 - (5) The expected total return from income and appreciation of investments;
 - (6) This corporation's other resources;

- (7) The needs of this corporation to make distributions and to preserve capital;
- (8) An asset's special relationship or special value, if any, to the charitable purposes of this corporation.

Board decisions about an individual investment shall be made not in isolation but rather in the context of this corporation's portfolio of investments as a whole and as a part of an overall investment strategy having risk and return objectives reasonably suited to this corporation.

Notwithstanding the above, no investment violates this Section where it conforms to: (a) the intent of the donor as expressed in a gift instrument; or (b) provisions authorizing such investment contained in an instrument or agreement pursuant to which the assets were contributed to this corporation.

Section 16. <u>Director Inspection Rights</u>. Every director shall have the absolute right at any reasonable time to inspect and copy all books, records, and documents, and to inspect the physical properties of this corporation.

Section 17. <u>Compensation of Directors</u>. The Board of Directors may authorize, by resolution, the payment to a director of reasonable compensation for services as a director. The Board may authorize the advance or reimbursement to a director of actual reasonable expenses incurred in carrying out his or her duties as a director, such as for attending meetings of the Board and Board Committees.

Section 18. Executive Compensation Review. The Board of Directors (or a Board Committee) shall review any compensation packages (including all benefits) of the President or the chief executive officer and the Treasurer or chief financial officer, regardless of job title, and shall approve such compensation only after determining that the compensation is just and reasonable. This review and approval shall occur when such officer is hired, when the term of employment of such officer is renewed or extended, and when the compensation of such officer is modified, unless the modification applies to substantially all of the employees of this corporation.

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES

Section 1. <u>Board Committees</u>. In addition to the committees set forth in these Bylaws, the Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors then in office, create any number of Board Committees, each consisting of two or more directors, and only of directors, to serve at the pleasure of the Board. Appointments to any Board Committee shall be by a majority vote of the directors then in office. Board Committees may be given all the authority of the Board, except that the Board may not delegate any of the following authorities, which are required to be held by the full Board by the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law or these Bylaws:

- (a) to fix compensation of directors for serving on the Board or any Board Committee;
- (b) to approve, together with the members, any amendments to the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation;
- (c) to amend or repeal any resolution of the Board of Directors which by its express terms is not so amendable or repealable;
- (d) to create any other Board Committees or appoint the members of any Board Committees;
- (e) to approve, together with the members, any merger, reorganization, voluntary dissolution, or disposition of substantially all of the assets of this corporation; and
- (f) to approve the annual grant-making and operating budgets of this corporation.
- Section 2. <u>Advisory Committees</u>. The Board of Directors may establish one or more Advisory Committees to the Board. The members of any Advisory Committee may consist of directors or non-directors and may be appointed as the Board determines. On matters requiring Board authority, Advisory Committees shall be restricted to making recommendations to the Board or Board Committees, and implementing Board or Board Committee decisions and policies under the supervision and control of the Board or Board Committee.
- Section 3. <u>Committee Supervision and Reliance</u>. If a committee is composed and appointed as required by Section 1 above (concerning Board Committees), it may act with the authority of the Board to the extent and with the scope provided by the Board. Otherwise, the Board of Directors shall remain responsible for oversight and supervision of the committee as an Advisory Committee. If a committee meets the criteria of Article V, Section 15.A.(iii), the individual directors may rely on it in discharging their fiduciary duties as provided in that Section.
- Section 4. <u>Audit Committee</u>. For any tax year in which this corporation has gross revenues of \$2 million or more, this corporation shall have an Audit Committee whose members shall be appointed by the Board of Directors, and who may include both directors and non-directors, subject to the following limitations: (a) members of the finance committee, if any, shall constitute less than one-half of the membership of the Audit Committee; (b) the chair of the Audit Committee may not be a member of the Finance Committee, if any; (c) the Audit Committee may not include any member of the staff, including the President or chief executive officer and Treasurer or chief financial officer; (d) the Audit Committee may not include any person who has a material financial interest in any entity doing business with this corporation; and (e) Audit Committee members who are not directors may not receive compensation greater than the compensation paid to directors for their Board service.

The Audit Committee shall: (1) recommend to the full Board of Directors for approval the retention and, when appropriate, the termination of an independent certified public accountant to serve as auditor, (2) subject to the supervision of the full Board, negotiate the

compensation of the auditor on behalf of the Board, (3) confer with the auditor to satisfy the Audit Committee members that the financial affairs of this corporation are in order, (4) review and determine whether to accept the audit, and (5) approve performance of any non-audit services provided to this corporation by the auditor's firm.

Section 5. Meetings.

- A. <u>Of Board Committees</u>. Meetings and actions of Board Committees shall be governed by and held and taken in accordance with the provisions of Article V of these Bylaws concerning meetings and actions of the Board of Directors, with such changes in the content of those Bylaws as are necessary to substitute the Board Committee and its members for the Board of Directors and its members. Minutes shall be kept of each meeting of any Board Committee and shall be filed with the corporate records.
- B. <u>Of Advisory Committees</u>. Subject to the authority of the Board of Directors, Advisory Committees may determine their own meeting rules and whether minutes shall be kept.

The Board of Directors may adopt rules for the governance of any Board or Advisory Committee not inconsistent with the provisions of these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VII OFFICERS

- Section 1. Officers. The officers of this corporation shall be a Chair of the Board, a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer. This corporation may also have, at the discretion of the Board of Directors, such other officers as may be appointed by the Board of Directors. Any number of offices may be held by the same person, except that neither the Secretary nor the Treasurer or Chief Financial Officer, may serve concurrently as the President or Chair of the Board. The Chair of the Board shall be elected from among the directors of this corporation.
- Section 2. <u>Election</u>. The Chair of the Board, and the Secretary shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors; the President and the Treasurer shall be hired and terminated by the Board as needed. All officers shall serve at the pleasure of the Board, subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment.
- Section 3. <u>Removal</u>. Subject to the rights, if any, of an officer under any contract of employment, any officer may be removed, with or without cause, by the Board of Directors or by an officer on whom such power of removal may be conferred by the Board of Directors.
- Section 4. <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to this corporation. Any resignation shall take effect on receipt of that notice by such officer or at any later time specified by that notice and, unless otherwise specified in that notice, the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective. Any resignation is

without prejudice to the rights, if any, of this corporation under any contract to which the officer is a party.

- Section 5. <u>Vacancies</u>. A vacancy in any office for any reason shall be filled in the same manner as these Bylaws provide for election to that office.
- Section 6. <u>Chair of the Board</u>. The Chair of the Board shall preside at all meetings of the members and the Board of Directors and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.
- Section 7. President. The President shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation and shall, subject to control of the Board, generally supervise, direct and control the business and other officers of this corporation, other than the Chair of the Board. The President shall be the most senior member of this corporation's staff, shall have the general powers and duties of management usually vested in the office of president of a corporation, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.
- Section 8. <u>Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall supervise the keeping of a full and complete record of the proceedings of the members and the Board of Directors and its committees, if any, shall supervise the giving of such notices as may be proper or necessary, shall supervise the keeping of the minute books and membership records of this corporation, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.
- Section 9. <u>Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall be the chief financial officer of this corporation and the most senior member of this corporation's financial staff, and shall supervise the charge and custody of all funds of this corporation, the deposit of such funds in the manner prescribed by the Board of Directors, and the keeping and maintaining of adequate and correct accounts of this corporation's properties and business transactions, shall render reports and accountings as required, and shall have such other powers and duties as may be prescribed by the Board or these Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII CERTAIN TRANSACTIONS

Section 1. <u>Loans</u>. Except as permitted by Section 5236 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, this corporation shall not make any loan of money or property to, or guarantee the obligation of, any director or officer; provided, however, that this corporation may advance money to a director or officer of this corporation or any subsidiary for expenses reasonably anticipated to be incurred in performance of the duties of such director or officer so long as such individual would be entitled to be reimbursed for such expenses absent that advance.

Section 2. <u>Self-Dealing Transactions</u>. Except as provided in Section 3 of this Article, the Board of Directors shall not approve, or permit this corporation to engage in, any self-dealing transaction. A self-dealing transaction is a transaction to which this corporation is a party and in which one or more of its directors has a material financial interest, unless the

transaction comes within Section 5233(b) of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law.

Section 3. <u>Approval</u>. This corporation may engage in a self-dealing transaction if the transaction is approved by a court or by the Attorney General. This corporation may also engage in a self-dealing transaction if the Board determines, before the transaction, that (a) this corporation is entering into the transaction for its own benefit; (b) the transaction is fair and reasonable to this corporation at the time; and (c) after reasonable investigation, the Board determines that it could not have obtained a more advantageous arrangement with reasonable effort under the circumstances. Such determinations must be made by the Board in good faith, with knowledge of the material facts concerning the transaction and the director's interest in the transaction, and by a vote of a majority of the directors then in office, without counting the vote of the interested director or directors.

Where it is not reasonably practicable to obtain approval of the Board before entering into a self-dealing transaction, a Board Committee may approve such transaction in a manner consistent with the foregoing requirements, provided that, at its next meeting, the full Board determines in good faith that the Board Committee's approval of the transaction was consistent with such requirements and that it was not reasonably practical to obtain advance approval by the full Board, and ratifies the transaction by a majority of the directors then in office without the vote of any interested director.

- Section 4. <u>Compliance with Private Foundation Rules</u>. Any provision of these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation of this corporation to the contrary notwithstanding, so long as this corporation is deemed to be a "private foundation" as defined in Section 509 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), this corporation:
- (a) shall distribute its income for each taxable year (and principal, if necessary) at such time and in such manner as not to subject this corporation to tax under Section 4942 of the Code;
- (b) shall not approve of, or engage in, any act of self-dealing as defined in subsection (d) of Section 4941 of the Code;
- (c) shall not retain any excess business holdings as defined in subsection (c) of Section 4943 of the Code;
- (d) shall not make any investments in such a manner as to subject this corporation to tax under Section 4944 of the Code; and
- (e) shall not make any taxable expenditure as defined in subsection (d) of Section 4945 of the Code.

ARTICLE IX INDEMNIFICATION AND INSURANCE

Section 1. Right of Indemnity. To the fullest extent allowed by Section 5238 of the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law, this corporation shall indemnify its agents, in connection with any proceeding, and in accordance with Section 5238. For purposes of this Article, "agent" shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a), including directors, officers, employees, other agents, and persons formerly occupying such positions; "proceeding" shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a), including any threatened action or investigation under Section 5233 or brought by the Attorney General; and "expenses" shall have the same meaning as in Section 5238(a), including reasonable attorneys' fees.

Section 2. Approval of Indemnity. On written request to the Board of Directors in each specific case by any agent seeking indemnification, to the extent that the agent has been successful on the merits, the Board shall promptly authorize indemnification in accordance with Section 5238(d). Otherwise, the Board shall promptly determine, by a majority vote of a quorum consisting of directors who are not parties to the proceeding, whether, in the specific case, the agent has met the applicable standard of conduct stated in Section 5238(b) or Section 5238(c), and, if so, shall authorize indemnification to the extent permitted thereby. If the Board cannot do so because there is no quorum of directors who are not party to the proceeding for which indemnification is sought, the Board shall promptly call a meeting of the members. At that meeting, the members shall determine whether, in the specific case, the applicable standard of conduct stated in such Section has been met, and, if so, the members shall authorize indemnification to the extent permitted thereby.

Section 3. <u>Advancing Expenses</u>. The Board of Directors may authorize the advance of expenses incurred by or on behalf of an agent of this corporation in defending any proceeding prior to final disposition, if the Board finds that:

- (a) the requested advances are reasonable in amount under the circumstances; and
- (b) before any advance is made, the agent will submit a written undertaking satisfactory to the Board to repay the advance unless it is ultimately determined that the agent is entitled to indemnification for the expenses under this Article.

The Board shall determine whether undertaking must be secured, and whether interest shall accrue on the obligation created thereby.

Section 4. <u>Insurance</u>. The Board of Directors may adopt a resolution authorizing the purchase of insurance on behalf of any agent against any liability asserted against or incurred by the agent in such capacity or arising out of the agent's status as such, and such insurance may provide for coverage against liabilities beyond this corporation's power to indemnify the agent under law.

ARTICLE X GRANTS ADMINISTRATION

Section 1. <u>Purpose of Grants</u>. This corporation shall have the power to make grants and contributions and to render other financial assistance for the purposes expressed in this corporation's Articles of Incorporation.

Section 2. <u>Board of Directors Oversight</u>. The Board of Directors shall exercise itself, or delegate, subject to its supervision, control over grants, contributions, and other financial assistance provided by this corporation. The Board shall approve a process for reviewing and approving or declining all requests for funds made to this corporation, which shall require such requests to specify the use to which the funds will be put, and include a mechanism for regular Board review of all grants made. The Board shall similarly approve a process for authorizing payment of duly approved grants to the approved grantee.

Section 3. <u>Refusal</u>; <u>Withdrawal</u>. The Board of Directors, in its absolute discretion, shall have the right to refuse to make any grants or contributions, or to render other financial assistance, for any or all of the purposes for which the funds are requested. In addition, the Board, in its absolute discretion, shall have the right to withdraw its approval of any grant at any time and use the funds for other purposes within the scope of the purposes expressed in this corporation's Articles of Incorporation, subject to any rights of third parties under any contract relating to such grant.

Section 4. Accounting. The Board of Directors shall determine under what circumstances to require that grantees furnish a periodic accounting to show that the funds granted by this corporation were expended for the purposes that were approved by the Board.

Section 5. Restrictions on Contributions. Unless otherwise determined by resolution of the Board of Directors in particular cases, this corporation shall retain complete control and discretion over the use of all contributions it receives, subject only to any charitable trust restrictions that apply to such contributions, and all contributions received by this corporation from solicitations for specific grants shall be regarded as for the use of this corporation and not for any particular organization or individual mentioned in the solicitation. This corporation may accept contributions earmarked by the donor exclusively for allocation to one or more foreign organizations or individuals only if the Board of Directors of this corporation: (1) has determined that the specific charitable activity for which the donation was made furthers this corporation's exempt purposes; (2) has approved in advance disbursements of funds to support such charitable activity; (3) retains discretion and control as to the use of the contributions received by this corporation, and (4) exercises appropriate supervision to ensure funds are actually spent for the intended purposes.

ARTICLE XI MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of this corporation shall end each year on December 31.

Section 2. <u>Contracts, Notes, and Checks.</u> All contracts entered into on behalf of this corporation must be authorized by the Board of Directors or the person or persons on whom such power may be conferred by the Board from time to time, and, except as otherwise provided by law, every check, draft, promissory note, money order, or other evidence of indebtedness of this corporation shall be signed by the person or persons on whom such power may be conferred by the Board from time to time.

Section 3. <u>Annual Reports to Members and Directors.</u>

- A. <u>Financial Report</u>. Unless this corporation receives less than \$25,000 in gross revenues or receipts during the fiscal year, within 120 days after the end of this corporation's fiscal year, the Board shall furnish a written report to all of the directors and members of this corporation containing the following information:
- (i) the assets and liabilities, including the trust funds of this corporation, as of the end of the fiscal year;
- (ii) the principal changes in assets and liabilities, including trust funds, during the fiscal year;
- (iii) the revenue or receipts of this corporation, both unrestricted and restricted for particular purposes, for the fiscal year;
- (iv) the expenses or disbursements of this corporation, for both general and restricted purposes, for the fiscal year; and
 - (v) any information required by subsection B below.

The foregoing report shall be accompanied by any report thereon of independent accountants or, if there is no such report, the certificate of an authorized officer of this corporation that such statements were prepared without an audit from the books and records of this corporation. The report and any accompanying material may be sent by electronic transmission in compliance with Article XI, Section 5, of these Bylaws.

If this corporation receives less than \$25,000 in gross revenues or receipts during the fiscal year, the report described above must be furnished only to the directors and any member who requests it in writing.

- B. Report of Certain Transactions. Unless this corporation furnishes the report required by subsection A above, within 120 days after the end of this corporation's fiscal year, the Board shall furnish a written report to all of the members and directors of this corporation containing the following:
- (i) a description of any transaction during the previous fiscal year involving more than \$50,000 between this corporation (or its parent or subsidiary, if any) and any of its directors or officers (or those of its parent or subsidiary, if any), or any member holding more than ten percent of the voting power of the membership of this corporation (or its parent or subsidiary, if any), including the names of the interested persons, their relationship to this

corporation, the nature of their interest in the transaction and, where practicable, the value of such interest; and

(ii) the amount and circumstances of any indemnifications or advances aggregating more than \$10,000 that were paid during the fiscal year to any director or officer of this corporation, and that were not approved by the members of this corporation.

If no transaction required to be reported has occurred during the fiscal year, no report is required for that fiscal year.

Section 4. Required Financial Audits. This corporation shall obtain a financial audit for any tax year in which it receives or accrues gross revenue of \$2 million or more, excluding grant or contract income from any governmental entity for which the governmental entity requires an accounting. Whether or not they are required by law, any audited financial statements obtained by this corporation shall be made available for inspection by the Attorney General and the general public within nine months after the close of the fiscal year to which the statements relate, and shall remain available for three years (1) by making them available at this corporation's principal, regional, and district offices during regular business hours and (2) either by mailing a copy to any person who so requests in person or in writing or by posting them on this corporation's website.

Section 5. <u>Electronic Transmissions</u>. Unless otherwise provided in these Bylaws, and subject to any guidelines and procedures that the Board of Directors may adopt from time to time, the terms "written" and "in writing" as used in these Bylaws include any form of recorded message in the English language capable of comprehension by ordinary visual means, and may include electronic transmissions, such as facsimile or email, provided (i) for electronic transmissions from this corporation, this corporation has obtained an unrevoked written consent from the recipient to the use of such means of communication; (ii) for electronic transmissions to this corporation, this corporation has in effect reasonable measures to verify that the sender is the individual purporting to have sent such transmission; and (iii) the transmission creates a record that can be retained, retrieved, reviewed, and rendered into clearly legible tangible form.

Section 6. <u>Electronic Transmissions to Members</u>. An electronic transmission by this corporation to a member is valid only if the following requirements have been satisfied:

- (i) The member has affirmatively consented (and has not withdrawn consent) to the use of electronic transmissions, as required by the preceding Section;
- (ii) If the member is a natural person, prior to or at the time of consenting, the member received a clear written statement informing him or her of:
 - a) any right or option to have the transmissions provided or made available on paper or in non-electronic form;
 - b) whether the consent applies only to that transmission, to specified categories of communications, or to all communications from this corporation; and

c) the procedures the member must use to withdraw consent.

Section 7. <u>Amendments</u>. Amendments to these Bylaws may be adopted by approval of (a) the members acting alone in accordance with Article III, Section 1, or (b) the Board of Directors (by the vote of a majority of the directors then in office, or the unanimous written consent of the Board) and the members (in accordance with Article III, Section 1). If a proposed Bylaw amendment will be considered at a meeting, it shall be submitted in writing to the persons entitled to vote thereon at least one week before such meeting.

Section 8. <u>Governing Law</u>. In all matters not specified in these Bylaws, or in the event these Bylaws shall not comply with applicable law, the California Nonprofit Public Benefit Corporation Law as then in effect shall apply.
